“Go Forward When You Can’t See the Way”

“And the LORD said unto Moses, Wherefore criest thou unto me? speak unto the children of Israel, that they go forward:” – Exodus 14:15

There are moments in the Christian life when obedience feels... unreasonable. Israel stood at the Red Sea with trouble behind them and no obvious road ahead. The enemy was real, the fear was loud, and the water was still water. And yet, into that impossible scene, God spoke two words that still preach: “Go forward.”

What makes Exodus 14:15 so powerful is this: God gave a command before He showed the path. The sea had not yet parted, the miracle wasn’t visible, and the situation still looked stuck. But God was teaching His people that faith doesn’t wait for perfect conditions—faith responds to a perfect Lord. Many times, the Lord’s will is not discovered by sitting still; it’s revealed as we obey step by step.

And notice God’s gentle correction: “Wherefore criest thou unto me?” That doesn’t mean prayer is wrong - prayer is essential. But it does mean there comes a time when praying must become moving. There is a point where the child of God says, “Lord, I’ve brought this to You... now help me obey You.” Some answers come after the step. Some victories come through the water. And some doors open only when we choose to go forward with God.

Dear partners, you may feel like you’re facing a “Red Sea” in your own life—health, finances, family burdens, uncertainty, ministry needs. Take heart: the same God who commanded His people to go forward is the God who made a way where there was no way. And as we move forward as a ministry, your prayers and support are not small things—they are steps of obedience that God uses to part seas in places we may never personally see.

A New Chapter of Ministry: Helping a Church in Need

Recently, Capital City Baptist Church in Lansing, Michigan reached out with an urgent need. According to their leadership, the church was on the verge of having to shut its doors and close permanently if help did not come soon. There are several unique matters that need to be addressed - growth, leadership, finances, and other situations that require immediate attention.

Because the church was familiar with me through OGI and my ministry background, they asked whether I would come and help during this season. After much prayer and Godly counsel, I have agreed to serve as a transition pastor. The purpose is to help stabilize the work, strengthen the ministry, and then assist them in finding the right pastor to shepherd the church faithfully for many years to come.

I also want to make this absolutely clear: I remain full-time as President of Operation Go International. Nothing is changing concerning my position with OGI, our current projects, or the direction God has given us. Our family and ministry base will remain in Bridgeport, Michigan, and we will travel back and forth to Lansing as needed. The main change is that my workload has expanded, but I am not canceling OGI meetings or trips, and by God's grace we will continue to see OGI move forward.

I would also ask you to understand this: your financial support for Operation Go International and myself is still needed and deeply appreciated. Your giving will continue to go directly toward furthering the projects of OGI—preaching the Gospel, reaching souls around the world, and training national pastors and leaders so the work can multiply long after we are gone. Thank you for standing with us as we keep pressing forward.

Please continue to pray that God will give wisdom, strength, and grace as I help this church in this season—and that the Lord will raise up the right shepherd to lead them long-term.


